PW: If providers have ten working days to respond, is the same time frame to be applied to CQC responses?	
SO: Not necessarily. E.g., If it is a lengthy response that comes back to us, that might involve, several members of an inspection of assessment team feeding into, to response to and to update the report. It might take longer than 10 days. We do have internal key performance indicators that we try to stick with to ensure that we publish our reports as promptly as possible and that applies to from the time we start assessment of publication.
