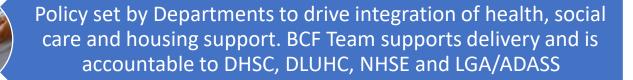








Main points





Clinical Commissioning Groups and local authorities must pool specific allocations and agree how these are being used to deliver integrated, personalised services



Commissioner plans, but LAs and CCGs much involve providers, VCS and housing colleagues in the plans



Plans also agree how progress will be made against performance metrics covering admissions avoidance, discharge and reablement

iBCF grant to councils	£2.077 billion

Additional CCG spend	£1.775 billion

Residential care	£1.54 billion
Domiciliary care	£944 million
Care planning, navigation and assessment	£919 million
Intermediate care (including reablement)	£1.03 billion
Community based services (neighbourhood services and MDTs)	£1.7 billion
HICM for managing transfers of care	£482 million
Prevention and early intervention	£189 million
Housing adaptations	£570 million





- BCF will continue in 22-23, with financial uplifts to CCG minimum and iBCF
- Negotiating conditions currently trying to put more focus on reducing hospital admissions, but BCf will continue to have a role in discharge
- BCF referenced in recent integration White Paper. Considering the implications of the proposals on pooling and integration at Place level on the fund.
