- Providing online training courses to a diverse group of people working in adult social care.

- Provide robust project management, with responsibility for monitoring, reporting and evaluating projects.
- Working with project partners and funders to facilitate and strengthen project deliverables.
- Engaging with our members, partners, and other interested groups to understand the fast-changing digital needs in social care. Also look for new ideas and projects that can improve these services through technology.
- Staying up to date with policy and regulatory expectations/requirements around the digitisation of adult social care.
- Staying up to date with emerging technology and digital systems relevant to the adult social care sector.
